Tim's thoughts about the possibility of owning such a business started a number of years before the actual reality of becoming kennel owners.

Having always had dogs of their own, with parents living nearby who could look after them – the thoughts of finding a suitable boarding establishment had never been an issue.

However, in 2000 Jackie, the family and her parents went on a cruise - this meant that suitable accommodation had to be found for the dogs. Jackie had her first experience of viewing boarding kennels:

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### I CAN DO BETTER

Jackie first approached Kennel & Cattery Design in September 2005 having found our website. From the outset it was very obvious that she was going to be a unique client determined to construct kennels to an extremely high standard.

Given her experiences when established boarding viewina kennels, she soon realised that it would be impossible to purchase an existing business that had the standard and design of kennels that they wanted to build.

During the intervening period Jackie was in regular contact Jackie and Tim are delighted with their end result and say that the building has exceeded all their original expectations. The building has 15 suites with double-glazed UPVC doors, underfloor heating with warm, vinyl floor coverings. The large size of the rooms and the design of the building make it an extremely calm, guiet and relaxing atmosphere to live and work in. This combined with the low number of dogs allows for lots of individual attention – is a winning combination which their customers delight in. There were also 'hidden' rewards for building such high standard dog-friendly accommodation, including things like how much easier the cleaning routine is, not only because of the vinyl finish, but also that there is little 'mess' to clear up. The dogs are very relaxed in their own private and quiet spaces, have comfortable, warm sleeping areas and get taken out several times a day. They behave as if they were at home, waiting for their late night or early morning visit outside.

with us to discuss design options, practical issues such as services, drainage, etc. The design finally chosen was an 'L' shape. The reasoning behind this was to minimise the stress and noise, and to create a building that was functional, while at the same time providing a facility that was simply in a league of its own. This fitted with Jackie's design brief and her commitment to provide a kennel facility that offered so much more than anything she had seen elsewhere. Finally, they moved into their new property in January 2006 and applied for planning permission 2 weeks later. At the parish council meeting Jackie explained why they wanted to construct such a facility; fortunately, all of the council members supported it wholeheartedly.

Unfortunately, the property straddles two county council borders; this meant that Cornwall Council had to liaise with Devon Council.
